BACKGROUND INFORMATION

After comparing our current liquor license fees to other jurisdictions, staff feels there is no need to increase most fees. However, liquor distributors/wholesalers are currently considered “Out of Town” businesses and pay \$150.00 per year. Staff is suggesting they are moved to a Liquor Distributor/ Wholesaler category and pay \$600.00 per year.
