AGENDA ITEM: (Possible action) Ratification of expenditures for repairs to the East Wastewater Treatment Facility for an amount not to exceed \$26,867 awarded to Reliant Electric.

Agenda Item Brief: Contract to replace damaged power equipment at the City of Fernley EWWTP. The damaged components are needed to treat the effluent prior to discharge to the Fernley wildlife management area.

ALTERNATIVES:

BACKGROUND:

On February 17, 2020 a garbage truck from Walker Lake Disposal accidently crashed into portions of the east wastewater facility. Specifically, a transformer that supplies power to key components and a light pole were demolished beyond repair by the truck. The damaged components are vital to the wastewater treatment process that treats the effluent water discharged to the wildlife management area. This contract is to ratify the expenditures to Reliant Electric for necessary repairs to the facility in order to ensure proper treatment of effluent.

The Walker Lake Disposal company has been cooperative, and the cost of the repair will be either reimbursed through the company directly or through their insurance. The driver of the garbage truck was at fault.

This work was required to get done as soon as possible for the wastewater treatment plant to be in compliance with the state permit. Two bids were received and Reliant was the lower bidder.
