Agenda Item Brief: This item is to ratify the expenditure for an emergency contract to repair one of two pumps for the HWY 50 Lift Station.

ALTERNATIVES:

BACKGROUND:

The HWY 50 sewer Lift station is a critical wastewater facility which transports approximately 25% of the city's sewer to the East Wastewater Treatment Facility. This facility operates on a 2-pump system to be able to keep up with demand. One of the two pump system failed making this facility more vulnerable for complete failure in which staff would potentially need to operate this facility in an emergency bypass state if the remaining pump in operation were to fail.

Staff awarded an emergency contract to Nevada Seal & Pump to remove the damaged pump and troubleshoot the issue. It was determined that the pump required major repairs in order to be brought back into operation. The necessary repairs were authorized and completed by Nevada Seal & Pump. The pump was reinstalled bringing this facility back into normal operation.
